

Skills for Industry 4.0 in the Age of Robotic and Digital Smart Production

On 2 May 2024, the project partners gathered for an online meeting, marking a critical milestone in the project. This meeting began with a detailed review of reports prepared following 3 workshops organized under Activity-1. These reports included observations and recommendations from the workshop participants. All partners thoroughly discussed this valuable feedback, fostering a shared understanding among the participants.

Another key agenda item for the meeting was the planning and preparation for an in-person meeting scheduled to take place in France on 17 May 2024. The main focus of this upcoming meeting was to evaluate the results of surveys conducted in the partner countries and to reach a consensus on the most in-demand skills to be addressed by the project.

The project's kick-off meeting was successfully held on Friday, 17 May 2024, in Goussainville, France. During the meeting, each partner presented the results of the surveys conducted in their respective regions and shared the data

collected with other participants. Following comprehensive evaluations, the surveys' outcomes guided the identification of 10 key skills for which training kits would be developed. These skills are as follows:

1. Automation and Robotics
2. Big Data Management
3. Production Process Information
4. Artificial Intelligence
5. Data Analytics
6. Problem-Solving Ability
7. Familiarization with New Technologies
8. Motivation and Self-Discipline
9. Analytical Ability
10. Openness to Learning

Partners assumed responsibility for preparing training modules related to these skills. The essential materials to be included in the training kits were outlined as follows:

1. Learning Outcome Matrix
2. Content of the Training
3. Presentation of the Training
4. Short Video of the Training
5. Evaluation Test of the Training Content
6. Presentation of Case Study
7. Short Video of Case Study

Following the meeting, the lead partner and other project partners began working on a draft training kit for the Big Data Management module. All these materials are expected to be completed by the next project meeting in Lithuania. The partners also agreed to maintain regular communication throughout this process to strengthen collaboration.
